Seasoning: Dries slowly and care is needed.

Working Qualities: In general, Oak finishes well from the planer or moulder although in some cases a reduction of cutting angle to 20° may be required. The timber can be stained, polished, waxed and glued satisfactorily, Pre boring when screwing or nailing near edges is recommended. It takes liming and fuming treatments well.


